## FAA/Liaison Determination Based on a Documented Interview

As mandated by the CCRAA, if a determination by any of the parties listed in the previous section cannot be made, the FAA/LIAISON must make the determination of unaccompanied and homeless status, or unaccompanied, self-supporting, and at risk of homelessness status.

If third party documentation is not available, a documented interview conducted by the FAA/LIAISON is sufficient to confirm that an unaccompanied homeless youth qualifies as independent. If the FAA disagrees with an authority's determination, the FAA must accept the determination, but may contact the oversight agency for the authority to evaluate the authority's determination. For more information, see the AVG. According to the AVG, the determination may be based on a documented interview with the student if there is no written documentation available. According to the AVG, the definition of homeless includes students living in the school dormitory if they would otherwise be homeless.

## The FAA/Liaison may make the determination based on the following information:

- Do you live with your parent/guardian? How often do you interact with your parents/guardians?
- Do your parents/guardians financially support you in any way? Do they help pay rent or other bills?
- How long have you been on your own? February of my Senior year, five days after I turned 18
- How are you supporting yourself?
- Tell me about where you are living.
- Is this a permanent arrangement or just temporary?
- Are you looking for another place to live? Do you plan to move out soon?
- Why are you staying in your current place?
- How long have you been staying there?
- Where were you living right before this place?
- Why did you leave?
- Where would you go if you couldn't stay where you are?
- Are you staying with friends/relatives just for a little while?
- Could your friends/relatives ask you to leave if they wanted to?
- Are you all sharing the home equally, or are you more like a guest in the home?
- Do you stay in the same place every night?
- How many people are living in the home? How many bedrooms/bathrooms does it have?
- Are you sleeping in a bedroom or a public area, like a dining room? How many people stay in one room?
- Does the home have heat/electricity/running water? Does it keep out rain and wind? Is it safe?
